Executive Summary

In the first quarter of 2009, implementation of CBA Project continued, with regional launching completed, and selection of pilot rayons and communities approaching almost to the end. Other important process e.g. institutional development, capacity building, participatory planning, plan mainstreaming, implementation of community initiatives took place albeit at different scale. Details about key activities are given hereunder:

Selection of pilot rayons was completed in Donetska oblast, reaching 100% coverage of the target rayons. In total, 201 rayons were selected in all regions. Following to the rayon selection, 17 village/city councils were selected in 6 regions during the quarter. In total, selection of 968 village/city councils was completed by end of 1st quarter 2009.

In the reported period, focus of Project activities shifted towards actual community mobilization and preparation and review of micro-project proposals. Through community dialogues, 210 Community Organizations were formed in the I quarter encompassing 36000 community members. In total, number of COs formed since inception amounts to 876 with involvement of 177,028 persons (60% female). To facilitate the process, CO-manual was prepared and disseminated.

141 training courses were held during the quarter to build capacity of community activists as well as focal persons from local governments. In cumulatively term, 454 trainings were held for about 10,000 persons (78% CO-members, 22% officials from local authorities).

248 COs prepared community development plans during the quarter. Of them, 229 plans were reviewed at Local Development Forum and 160 were approved by the Forum. Priority in the plans was focused on energy savings (50%, followed by water supply (27%), healthcare services (15%), local transport (6%), environment (2%).

In the reported period, 65 community micro-project proposals were approved for funding (total amount of projects approved is 105). In the 1st quarter, financing was released (from CBA project side) for 37 community projects of 10 oblasts, amounting to UAH 508 335. Total cost of all the 105 projects approved since inception is UAH 14,879 million of which 9% came from the beneficiary COs, 11% from the village/city councils, 33% from the rayon authorities, 2% from oblast authorities, 1% from the private sectors and remaining 44% from the CBA.

Extensive media coverage of Project activities in the regions was traced. During the quarter, 181 media coverages were registered across Ukraine, including printed and electronic editions, radio and TV reportages. Total coverage since inception amounts to 979. Also, 29 issues of regional newsletters were published and disseminated among target audience during the guarter.

In the 2nd quarter of 2009, target will be accomplished in terms of partnership with the regions, rayons, VC/CCs and COs. Focus will be placed on capacity building, planning and implementation of community initiatives. Documentation and dissemination of lessons learned will be carried out vigorously.

CHAPTER I

1.1 Project Genesis

1.1.1 Background

Ukraine has made significant economic development since its independence. However, it is still challenged by some serious issues. Economic growth is not equitable, with only small share of population benefiting from its fruit. Those who suffer most live in rural and semi-urban areas. Low living standards in these areas are characterized, besides low income, by insufficient access to medical care and education, underdeveloped (or worn out) basic infrastructure and poor access to drinking water. Social, health and environmental problems at local level have is very common and warrant serious attention.

These challenges form a part of the MDG signed by Ukraine in 2000. To achieve these goals, much work is needed, especially at local level. The experience around the world¹ indicate that solution to these challenges is contingent on empowerment and active involvement of local communities, and their capacity to identify development priorities and ensure their attainment. However, legacy of the highly centralised system of policy, planning, budgeting and decision-making is yet to be adequately geared towards accommodating the needs and priorities as perceived by citizens and local authorities. On the other hand, passive attitude of the population in general and limited capacity of the local governments in rural areas to generate revenue remains a challenge.

Experience of European Commission's projects on pilot models for sustainable regional and local development have indicated the need to emphasize 'bottom-up" approach in tackling social needs of the poor population. On the other hand, Area-Based Development (ABD) Approach promoted by UNDP Ukraine through its projects² has proven to be an effective way of achieving social goals in a decentralised manner. In close partnership with local authorities and local communities, ABD Approach unleashes the potential of the people to help themselves. It brings local authorities and communities together for joint problem-solving and development activities, thus reinforcing the MDGs.

Joint EC-UNDP initiative - the Community-Based Approach to Local Development (CBA) is founded on the achievements of ABD approach and is meant for applying its main tenets country-wide and provide valuable inputs for the ongoing policy debate on administrative and fiscal decentralisation and further democratisation of society. CBA Project was launched in September 2007 and functioning since January 2008.

1.1.2 Objectives

Main objective of the CBA Project is to create enabling environment for long-term self-sustaining social-economic and environmental development at local level throughout Ukraine.

Specific objectives of the Project are to:

- Improve living conditions in rural and (semi-) urban communities through sustainable communitybased self-help initiatives;
- Demonstrate participatory local governance, joint decision making and public private partnership for decentralised public service delivery through self-governing community organisations;
- Enhance professional skills and knowledge of community organizations and local authorities to initiate and maintain participatory local process on sustainable social economic development and public services delivery;
- Document experience on participatory planning, decision-making and social action with a view to providing inputs for policy and legal reforms.

1.1.3 Project Strategy

The strategic goal of the CBA is to build capacity for participation of the local communities and local authorities into joint decision making process and use this capacity for multi-stakeholders cooperation and multi-sectoral interventions that are geared towards strengthening of local governance and sustainable

human development with ensured local ownership of the process. To this end, following strategies are followed to materialise the objectives of the Programme.

All oblasts of Ukraine and in Autonomous Republic of Crimea form the overall project area of CBA while selected raiyons, village/city councils and local communities form the functional area. Selection is based on the level of socio-economic hardship facing them. Partnership, based on willingness and commitment for cost sharing, form the basis of Project implementation in the selected area.

ABD approach is utilized to unleash the potentials of selected communities to address their common needs focused around health, environment, energy, water supply and local transportation. To this end, the selected communities are organised into 'community organisation (CO)' founded on norms of good governance.

Appropriate support structures are created at various levels to facilitate smooth implementation of the Project. Through networking of local communities, local/regional authorities, private sector and civil societies appropriate fora are established at rayon/oblast level so that they can hold regular dialogue on sustainable development envisioning, mainstreaming of community plans, deciding upon public-private partnership mechanism for implementation of local priorities and carrying out participatory monitoring. Networking of stakeholders at the national level enables overall monitoring and advisory support.

Capacity of duty-bearers in the local communities, local government as well as national level officials is complemented through capacity building activities. Capacity of the COs is built in such a way that they are able to make joint decision with local authorities, mobilize resources, implement local priorities and sustain the result. Capacity of the partners (VC/CC, raiyon/oblast etc.) is strengthened in terms of human resources to implement participatory approach propagated by the Project. Training, exposure visits, dialogues and small grants (for community projects), appropriate instituional mechanisms etc. are used as tools for building capacity.

Appropriate management and information systems (MIS) is established to make the stakeholders directly involved in the process of monitoring and assessment of the Project activities. It includes process monitoring, input monitoring, output monitoring and impact monitoring. Flow of information is bottom-up and participatory.

Sustainability of the systems, institutions (community organizations etc.) and services established at local community level under support of the Project is ensured so as not to loose the principles and value propagated by the Project.

1.2 Project Area


CBA Project will work in all oblasts of Ukraine and Autonomous Republic of Crimea covering total of 200 rayons (eight in every oblast in average) and 1000 villages/settlements/cities (five in every raiyon in average) with population less than 10,000 people.

CHAPTER II





PROJECT ACTIVITIES AND RESULTS



2.1. Establishment of Partnership with Regional/Local Authorities

Establishment of formal partnership with oblast authorities is considered to be a milestone in CBA implementation. Such agreements are also essential to formalize the role and commitment of the partners (local authorities and UNDP) and to provide an official basis to work with community organizations. Activities of CBA Project in all the regions rely on this partnership which was formalized with 22 oblasts by signing agreements.

Establishment of formal partnership with rayon authorities, through signing of partnership agreement, is considered to be second milestone in CBA implementation. It ensures clear role and commitment of the rayon authorities and provides an official basis to reach village/city councils. To this end, following steps were followed during the guarter.

2.1.1. Establishment of Partnership with Pilot Rayons

In the first quarter 2009, 8 applications were received from rayons of Donetska oblast. All of them were approved to be pilot rayons of CBA Project based on assessment made by the rayon selection committee involving representatives from Donetska Oblast State Administration, Oblast Council, UNDP and CBA Project. The selected rayons are:

1. Artemivskiy,
2. Slovyanskiy,
3. Kostyantynivskiy,
4. Krasnoarmiyskiy
5. Telmanivskiy,
6. Starobeshivskiy,
7. Novoazovskiy,
8. Dobropilskiy

Since inception, all 200 pilot rayons (and 1 city council) from all the 25 regions of Ukraine were selected for participation in CBA Project.

With coverage of rayons in Donetska oblast, CBA achieved 100% coverage of the target rayons.

2.1.2. Partnership between UNDP and rayons

Partnership between CBA and rayon authorities is formalized through signing of partnership agreements. It ensures clear role and commitment of the rayon authorities and provides an official basis to reach village/city councils.

In the reported period, 2 partnership agreements were signed by rayons of Odeska oblast. Totally since inception, 179 agreements were signed by rayons authorities.

2.1.3. Establishing Partnership with Village / City Councils

During the reported period, 49 applications for partnership were received from village/city councils of 6 regions namely Ivano-Franivska, Mykolaiivska, Kyivska, Kharkivska, Lvivska and Volynska.

The team of the oblast community resource centre analysed the information of the applications and information received from the respective rayon state administrations. Based on the analysis, they made a ranking of the participating local councils based on the socio-economic hardship and commitment.

The ranked applicants were discussed in 'village/city council selection committee' meetings held for the rayons ready for VC/CC selection. In the 1st quarter, 2009 17 local councils were selected as shown in Table - I.

In some oblasts, 13 local councils were re-selected because (a) previous pilot councils either rejected to continue cooperation or (b) did not fulfil their commitments under cooperation with CBA.

In all cases, the meeting was presided by CBA focal point of Oblast State Administration. Other participants of the meeting included representatives from regional council, rayon state administrations, rayon councils, and CDOs in the oblast.


Local partners were supportive towards methodology offered by CBA as they recognised its value in the local governance and sustainable development. Their opinions are quoted in Box 1.

Total number of pilot local councils amounts to 968 since inception of the Project. Among them, 86% are village councils, 12% town councils and 2% city councils (see Chart 1). Regionwise data about selection of village/city/town councils is given in Annex - I.

In the 1st quarter 2009, process of signing official terms of partnership with local councils was activized. In total, 107 agreements were signed between CBA and COs of 13 regions. Sumska oblast was the most active in this regard, where 34 partnerships were signed (See Table - II).

Total amount of partnerships signed since inception is 551 of the targeted 1000. Signing of ToPs was fast in majority of the regions. It was slow in 9 regions either because the focus was placed more on community aspects of the Project or the Project launching in the rayon/local councils was slow. Regionwise number of agreements since inception is given in Annex - II.



2.1.4 Initiation and response gap


Experience show that in general there is a gap between initiation of proposal for partnership by CBA and concrete formal establishment of partnership. There are many reasons for the gap as described below.

Chart – II: Partnership Initiation and Signing Response (since inception)




26 regional seminars were launched in total since 2008, mostly focused in first half of 2008. 22 regions signed partnership agreement. Some of the regional authorities signed partnership agreement during the seminar itself, while some took time. Delay in response was observed due to $-\,$

- Necessity for deep understanding of the project concept, strategy, terms of partnership;
- Internal consultation within relevant departments and experts;
- Understanding to be reached between OSA and OC;
- Time taken in seeking approval from the relevant ministry;
- Change in the leadership of the OSA;
- Old mindset of the officials;
- Placing of more value on money than on technology.



In total 193 rayon seminars were conducted in 2008 while 177 of them signed partnership. Many of the rayon authorities signed partnership agreement during the seminar itself. In some cases, they signed agreement, in group, during the regional seminar itself. Some rayons took time to sign the agreement. The dealy was mainly due to:

- Change in the leadership of the RSA;
- Waiting for OSA/OC to sign their agreement first.



A total of 897 VC/CC level seminars were held during 2008 while 440 of them signed partnership agreement. Almost no partnership agreement were signed during the seminar. The time gap was much bigger compared to that in case of regional and rayon. Main reasons for these gaps were:

- High focus of CBA on community level action, just after the VC/CC seminar than on signing partnership agreement;
- Time taken at CBA/UNDP in designating the officials who would sign agreement with VC/CC.

2.2. Institutionalization of Partnership with Local Authorities

To ensure participatory approach in decision-making, appropriate forum is developed at regional and district level so that stakeholders. Furthermore, community resource centres are created within framework of oblast and rayon authorities to keep the forums active and effective. Progress on this subject is described in details hereunder:

2.2.1. Project coordination at oblast level

An oblast coordination council (OCC) is formed under the chair of head/deputy head of OSA/OSC and in participation of representatives of local development forums (LDFs), relevant departments, selected VCs/CCs, COs, NGOs and business sector. An OCC coordinates project financing and implementation and participation of national partners; ensures proper awareness of regional and local governments; provides strategic advice on Project implementation and assists in using Project outputs for national strategy and policy development.

During the quarter, one OCC was formed in 4 oblast. Since inception, 10 OCC were formed, in ARC, Cherkaska, Luhanska, Lvivska, Mykolaivska, Sumska, Ternopilska, Zaporizka, Zhytomyrska and Vinnytska oblasts. Meetings of these forums focused on following key areas:

- Declaration of OCC formation and approaval of its statute
- Hearing of the report on Project implementation in oblast
- Financial commitments of partners
- Support from local authorities to preparation, review and approval of micro-projects.

2.2.2. Project Coordination at Rayon Level

Practical cooperation with rayon authorities continues primarily through the mechanism of holding joint Local Development Forums (LDF). These forums are establis hed by a decree of local administration, in each partner raiyon, as per the provision in the partnership with RSA/RC. They normally consist of representatives of rayon leadership and heads of relevant units, heads of village councils and CO chairpersons. LDF aims to facilitate dialogue, coordination, planning and decision-making at local level between the oblast and rayon authorities and communities for promoting integration and development. Meetings are held regularly to discuss local development issues such as to mainstream community plans, to support community organizations for technical backstopping and resource mobilization implementation, and handover of community projects.

During the quarter LDFs were formed in 48 rayons of 13 oblasts. Since inception, LDFs were formed in 146 rayons, and 191 sittings were held. Details are presented in Annex - IV.

Box - 2. LDF as a Platform of Interaction with Authorities and Promotion of Community Needs

Community organization *Dovira 2009* was not active and united at the very beginning of its existence. All meetings were held in local school, and later in village council premises. Despite the energy and great effort made by the village head, the community could not select its priorities.

However, after local businesswoman Olha Myronchuk joint the work, the process got more effective. CO activities became more coordinated and logical.CO was registered within 45 days, its activists visited every household and collected more than 9 000 UAH to realize the project on purchase of a school bus.

By virtue of participation in the forum business sector and religious sector also enrich decision making process for local development. Not only village head and principal of local school but also representatives from local business, head of veteran organization, local priest came to present and defend their project at LDF. They managed to convince rayon leadership that it was necessary to buy bigger and more expensive bus for the village. Despite local budget extremity LDF agreed to allocate 100 000 UAH, UAH 55,000 addition to the previously planned budget of 45 000 UAH. This made possible to plan purchase of PAZ bus in stead of previously planned minibus HAZel.

2.2.3. Rayon Community Resource Centers (RCRC)

Rayon Community Resource Centre is established at the pilot rayon state administration to ensure institutional memory, to coordinate CBA implementation in the rayon and to disseminate information on

CBA implementation in the rayon. It is run by the rayon focal person. It may assume informal (with low visibility) or formal status with high visibility depending upon the situation.

During the quarter 16 CRCs were formed in 6 oblasts (Table- IV). Since inception, 40 Community Resource Centres were formed in 9 oblasts. Luhanska and Kyivska oblasts were most enthusiastic in establishing sustainable CRCs for conducting further community oriented activities. Details about formation of RCRCs are given in Annex - V.

According to terms of partnership with CBA Project, focal points were appointed in each RSA/RC to coordinate Project implementation in the rayon, to cooperate with CDOs. As estimated by Community Development Officers, rayon focal persons are mostly engaged in coordination and organization of LDF (in 95% of oblasts) and assistance in community mobilization (85%). They also assist in mainstreaming community plans (75%) and mobilization of resources (70%). Details are given in Chart - III.

2.3. Organizing Local Communities

Following to selection of village/city councils, steps were taken to select the settlement(s) / local community and mobilize them for concrete action under the framework of CBA Project. Since inception, , 971 local communities were organised to work with CBA through following process:

2.3.1. Holding VC/CC level seminars

Orientation was organised in the selected VCs/CCs, individually or collectively, to present CBA Project to the council members, VC/CC-executives, active citizens, NGOs and businesses from the locality.

In perspective of the partnership with oblast and rayon authorities, the seminar focused on sensitizing the local representatives with importance of community-based approach to local development and explaining them the relevant procedure and conditions to achieve concrete results. Participation of the oblast and rayon officials in these local seminars reflected their commitment towards citizens' participation in decision-making process and raised effectiveness of the seminar (Table - III).

In the 1st quarter, 97 VC/CC level seminars were held in 15 regions. About 2500 persons participated in the seminars, including 130 focal persons of CBA project from oblast/rayon level. Since inception, 951 seminars were conducted in participation of about 25000 persons. Details on VC/CC seminars are given in Annex - VI.

2.3.2. Selection of Local Communities

Subsequent to the VC/CC seminar, the participants discussed on the comparative situation of the settlements belonging to the council from the perspective of socio-economic hardship facing them e.g. water supply, health services, energy efficiency, environment and school transportation etc. Based on the ranking, one settlement per VC/CC was selected for CBA Project. Alternative arrangement was made to ensure competition and attract the community which was the most willing and committed to apply self-help approach to resolve their problem.

During the quarter, 54 communities were selected for partnership in 9 Oblasts (Table - IV). Cumulatively, the number of pilot communities reached 959 by end of the first quarter, with 445 communities in reserve list (details in Annex - VII).

Box - 3. Masevychi Community's Enthusiasm Gets Rewarded

On 8th July 2008, village council selection committee put Masevychi VC in reserve list. Village activists were very disappointed at such decision but did not lose faith and decisded to prove that their community is worth becoming a pilot. On that very day they held the first community meeting, where people voted to create a community orgazniation and called it *Vidrodzhennya*, selected activists, approved the statute, and applied to the CBA Project management for including them in all seminars, dialogues and trainings held in frames of the CBA Project.

Active position of the community was really impressive. Taking into consideration that representatives from the community participated in trainings, did not miss a meeting, and stating passive attitude of Snovydovytska village council on 8th July 2008 second meeting of village council selection committee was held that resulted in a decree to include reserve Masevychi VC in cooperation with the CBA Project. That very month CO *Vidrodzhennya* was registered as a legal entity, opened an account, produced a seal and started to actively elaborate micro-project proposals and to defend it at LDF of Rokytnivsky rayon. In December CO *Vidrodzhennya* obtained award for its efforts, namely, CO' micro-project proposal *Energy Saving Activities in Masevychi School* was approved.

Finally comes good result of CO faith, activity and aspiration for improving their lives. On 19th February 2009 Partnership Agreement between UNDP/CBA Project and CO *Vidrodzhennya* from Masevychi village (Masevychi VC, Rokytnivsky rayon) was officially signed.

In this way, competitive approach allows CBA to single out most enthusiastic communities and work with them to demonstrate the use of community based approach to local development in practice.

2.3.3. Formation of Community organizations

Pursuant to the community selection, first dialogues were held with the selected communities to sensitize them about importance of collective effort to resolve local development issues in partnership with local authorities and other development agencies including CBA Project (Box - 4).

Box - 4. Holding Dialogues with Communities

Dialogue is a two-way transparent communication whereby OIU delivers its messages to the participants with logic, facts, figures, pictures and examples (from elsewhere in the country or abroad) while the audience tries to understand relevance of the message into their lives, process to be followed and seek clarification if required. In the CBA Project, at least 4 dialogues are foreseen:

- **Dialogue I**: is held to familiarise the inhabitants regarding importance of 'organisation, capital and skill' and process of forming community organisation (CO) based on the elements of good governance;
- **Dialogue II**: is held to familarise the CO-members with the need and process of participatory planning and bottom-up planning process;
- **Dialogue III**: is conducted to familiarize the CO-members with the process of establishing accountability, transparency and participatory monitoring;
- Dialogue IV: is carried out to familiarize the CO-members with the concept and process of sustainability of services and benefits

During the quarter, first dialogue was held in 165 communities of 17 oblasts (Table - V). In cumulative term, 971 first dialogues were held with local communities since inception (Annex - VIII). With this, the level of first dialogue reached above 90% of the potential minimum target of 1000 first dialogues. Summarized data on holding dialogues with local communities is given in Table - V.

2.3.4. CO formation process and Legal forms of COs

As a result of the first dialogues, 210 COs were formed in the 1st quarter (see Table - VI) in participation of 36000 households, which represented 79.4% of the total households on the CO-territory. The highest percentage of coverage was noted in Khmelnytska, Odeska, Kyivska, Kharkivska and Lvivska oblasts (Chart - V). Some of the other regions had reached higher achievement in 2008 itself while some regions were still in the process of community selection and first dialogue. As a result, their progress is seen as lower

In total, 41535 persons represented the households to become members of their COs. Of them, 30.3% were male and 69.7% were female.

Since inception, 876 CO were formed in all regions of Ukraine except in Donetska, where the the ryaon selection took place only in March 2009. A total of 150 934 households participated in the COs through representation of 215 363 members (35.4% male and 64.7% female). Female strength also existed in CO-management team with 59% of executive members being female (Chart - IV). Details on cumulative information are given in Annex – IX.

Chart - IV. Gender Balance in CO-MT




Box - 5. Communities are Best United Around a Common Problem

Communities from Vatutino and Vilkhuvatka villages have a very ambitious aim, i.e. to reconstruct street lighting on all the territory of village council, so that all community members could have benefit from micro-project realization. It was necessary to organize and unite 600 people to attract the majority of stakeholders! There are no even premises on the territory of village council big enough to seat all these people at a time. Besides, the majority of able-bodied villagers worked outside of the village, which also made the possibility of holding a general meeting more complicated. But the community has already had the experience of self-organization, namely, they have installed a gas supply system in their village, jointly performed other important for the village activities.

To attract people, activists of community organization visited every household, organized a meeting at every street and got support of 600 villagers. As a result, Vatutivo community has already collected necessary contribution to realize the project, and was one of the first in Kharkivska oblast to elaborate quite complicated technically microproject proposals. Village council also joints the project realization, as the community development plan is included in the VC development plans. Village council financed elaboration of the street lighting reconstruction project and bought energy counters. VC does not stop at the done and is going to assign additional 7 000 UAH to co-finance the project and take serving and paying for energy from street lights upon itself. The community in its turn is ready to maintain the system in good working order in case that VC has budget problems.

There is positive experience in Vatutino and Vilkhuvatka villages of solving problems together. As a result, people trust each other more. There is also experience of so called self-taxing, i.e. voluntary fees of every community member for common needs. And what is the most important, there are community activists, who report about new ideas and start changes at every street, from household to household, from one person to the other.




Chart - VI: First Dialogue Initiation and CO Formation (since inception)

It was observed that there is a time lag between the first dialogue and formation of community organisation. The time lag was mainly due to time needed to:

- fully understand the concept, methodology and terms and partnership;
- · reach consensus within the community;
- get indication from their respective VC/CC regarding possible budgetary support.

Among 876 CO formed since inception, 643 (73%) are already legally registered (Chart - VII). Legal formed preferred by most communities for their organizations is *public organization* (87%). The rest is shared by bodies of self-organization of population (5%), cooperatives (3%), associations of co-owners of multi-apartment buildings (3%) and others (2%). Distribution of legal forms is visualized in Chart - VIII.





Chart - VII: Registration Status of COs

2.3.5. Organizational Maturity

It is important that the CO must reach certain level of maturity before undertaking development task of significant size. To this end, the COs undertake small social/economic/environmental activities of household and community nature during first few months within their own capacity and within the resources available locally.

Most COs implement self-funded initiatives before they receive funding from CBA for their micro-project. Typical cases of such initiatives are: repair works, cleaning the nearby territory, planting trees etc.

Box - 6. Organized Communities Can Do Much More

(examples of communities self-funded initiatives)

In Matusiv Village of Shpolyansky rayon (Cherkaska oblast), villagers liked the idea of community activation around certain problem solving, so one more community organization was created in the village. This CO rented ponds situated on the territory of VC. CO members collect membership fees and direct them on development of ponds economy. Besides, CO members decided to spend money earned by using these ponds on their better arrangement, namely, ponds cleaning; filling with fish; arranging a recreation zone for villagers and guests; cleaning and installing of dust heaps etc.

In Yampil village of Bilohirskyi rayon (Khmelnytska oblast), heating system was repaired in local kindergarten. It is a self-funded initiative by the community for which UAH 50'000 were raised. Community drafted the project and hopes for CBA support to introduce more energy saving by replacement of windows and doors.

In Yepifanivka village of Kreminskyi rayon (Luhanska oblast) local citizen already practice implementation of joint initiatives such as organization of dance studio for local children and repair works in local health post. Now community drafted and is in the process of implementation of its micro-project on purchase of new equipment for this medical institution.

2.4. Developing Capacity

Capacity building is one of the crucial activities of CBA Project. It involves such activities as training, exposure visits, dialogues and various other forms of techniques utilized for skill enhancement/knowledge transfer. The purpose is to enable local communities, local authorities and other partners to adopt and practice the approach promoted by the Project. During the quarter, capacity building activities were focused on communities' representatives and counterparts from local councils. Details on these events are given hereunder:

2.4.1. Training of CBA project staff and national counterparts

Durign the quarter, 2-days orientation session was provided to 5 newly recruited Community Development Officers from Lvivska, Cherkaska, Donetska, Kirovohradska and Zakarpatska oblasts and Monitoring Assistantn of PMU. Training included mechanism of CBA implementation, communications, monitoring and reporting, finance and administrative issues etc.

2.4.2. Training for COs

The success of a CO largely depends on (a) capacity of its executive body to manage the organisation and its activities (b) knowledge and understanding of its general members about the principles of sustainable development and good governance. Therefore, the oblast implementation units organize trainings for CO-MT and counterparts/focal points of corresponding local councils which allows for a higher degree of involvement and engagement of local counterparts.

CBA Project offers training and orientation courses for CO-members in following areas –

- 1) CO Management;
- 2) Book-keeping in CO;
- 3) Community planning;
- 4) Drafting MPP.

In the first quarter, 141 trainings were organized for 3164 representatives of COs and local authorities (see Table - VII) to familiarise them with the essence of community-based approach. They learned how to create, register and maintain a community organization; how to write and defend a project proposal, and how to implement an initiative to improve the living quality of local community. Of the total persons trained, 55% were females and 45% were males. Also, 20% of participants were were from local authorities (focal points from village/city councils) while 80% of them representated COs.

Totally since inception, more that 10,000 persons from local communities and local governments received training and build up their capacity through 454 trainings organizaed by CBA Project. About 58% of the trainees were female and about 22% of them beloned to local government institutions (Chart - IX). Details about CBA trainings by oblast are given in Annex - XI. In general these trainings were perceived as useful by the participants as reflected by their opinion in Box - 7.

Chart - IX: CO Training Participants by Sex





Chart – X: CO Training Participants by Institution

2.5. Community Development Plans (CDP)

CBA aims to improve living condition of local communities and strengthen participatory governance. For this purpose, it supports participatory planning in the community to enable them to identify local needs; prioritise them based on such criteria as equity, do-ability, sustainability and cost sharing; and get the community priorities mainstreamed into local development plans through joint decision-making process.

2.5.1. Preparation of and mainstreaming of community development plan (CDP)

240 second dialoigues were conducted during the quarter to initiate participatory planning in the COs. High level of 2nd dialogues took place in Cherkaska, Dnipropetrovska, Kharkivska. Kirovogradska and Odeska oblasts. For other regions, either this stage was already over or they just begun the planning process (as reflected in cumulative column). In regions like Donetska, the stage is yet to come. In total, 63% of 2nd dialogues were held against the minimum potential target of 1000. Details are given in Table - VIII below:

During the quarter, 248 COs defined priorities of local infrastructure development by compiling community development plans as given in Table - IX. Most communities prioritized energy saving as top priority (50%), followed by water supply (27%) and medical services (15%) as their primary need. Less pressing is the problem of local transportation (6%) and environmental problems (2%). Distribution of priorities among all CDPs of 1st quarter is visualized in Chart - XI.

229 COs submitted their priorities to their respective VCs/CCs for approval. Plans concurred by VCs/CCs were then discussed at LDF meetings. Of all the plans discussed, 160 plans were approved by LDFs and recommended for financing (Chart - XII).

Chart - XI: Priorities of CDPs in I Quarter 2009





Chart – XII: Share of CDP approved by LDF in reviewed by LDF in I Quarter 2009



Sicne inception, 646 CDPs were developed by local communities. According to the existing trend, most of them prioritize energy saving (52%), water supply (22%) and healthcare (20%). 570 of these CDPs were reviewed at LDFs and 419 of them were approved for funding i.e. mainstreamed into local development plan. Details are given in Annexes XII and XIII.

2.5.2. Micro-Projects Proposals

Upon approval from LDFs, COs prepared and submitted 143 Micro project proposals (MPPs) to CBA/PMU. The received MPPs went through an appraisal, review and approval process at CBA/PMU. A total of 65 micro-project proposals were approved by CBA Project. Of the approved MPPs, 64% belonged to energy saving, 28% belonged to health purpose, 19% belonged to water supply and 9% - to local transportation (Table – X).

Since inception of CBA activities, 105 micro-project proposals were approved by CBA. Most of them are aimed at energy saving (60%) and healthcare (21%). Chart – XIII: Micro-projects by Typology Since Inception




Total cost of all the 105 approved project is about UAH 14,9 mln with an average cost UAH 141, 676 per micro-project. According to the cost-sharing arrangement, micro-projects will be co-funded by local budget (46%) with 11% contribution from village/city budget, 34% from rayon budget and 1% from oblast budget. Average input of CO is 9% and that of CBA share constitutes 44%. Moreover, communities managed to attract private sector to co-fund their initiatives (1%). Details are given in Table - XI and Chart - XIV.

Box - 8. CBA Communities Grow Confident Enough to Initiate Development Processes

Tarasivka village of Velykopysarivsky rayon (Sumska oblast) is a small settlement with typical village problems. The CBA project started working in this village only in October 2008. The community got united around solving the problem of water supply. To improve the quality of fresh water it was necessary to replace old water tower and a part of old water pipe that supplies village public organizations and some households with fresh water.

In the process of capacity building, community became very organziaed and confident enough to initiate development processes on their own. Villagers did not count on help of the state and local authorities, collected money and bought a water tower. Village council made helped with technical drawings and cost estimate. Now the most important is left, i.e. to write micro-project proposals, and receive finance from UNDP and cofinance from local budget for installation of new water tower closer to the settlement and repair part of water supply system.

2.5.3. Beneficiaries of Community Projects

It is expected that at least 107,700 persons will benefit from the realization of the 105 initiatives on improvement of living quality. Of them, 44% are males, 56% are females. Distribution of beneficiaries by gender and type of project is presented in Chart - XV and Chart - XVI. Genderwise and sectorwise details of beneficiaries are given by region in Annex – XV and Annex - XVI.

Chart – XV: Beneficiaries of Community Projects by Typology During the Quarter





Chart – XVI: Beneficiaries of Community Projects by Sex



Box - 9. One of the First Community Micro-Projects is to Benefit the Population of 3 Villages

In Krasna Polyana village of Chervonohvardijsky rayon (AR Crimea) project of repairing and equipping of village outpatient clinic has already been completed, where village council contribution is four times bigger than that of the CBA Project and amounts 220 000 UAH. It will benefit the population of 3 villages at least. Moreover, the community decided to create savings fund and count off 50 kopeks from each household to use this money on maintenance and equipping of local outpatient clinic (the fund is additional to current financing from VC that covers basic expenses). Besides, according to the scheme approved by the community, patients that are not members of the community have to pay for medical services.

Box - 10. Reaction of Local Community Members to Micro-Project Realization

«News about our project approval by the selection committee gave us hope that our school will look the way we have dreamt about». Sergiy Tukalo, leader of CO Nesvatkivske syajvo, Nesvatkove village, Oleksandrivsky rayon, Kirovohradska oblast

«It is very difficult to search for financing from the budget in crisis conditions. But we have no right to lose such a possibility as participation in the project and reserve initiatives». **Leybzon O.**, Head of Muzykivska VC, Muzykivka village, Bilozersky rayon, Khersonska oblast

«Assistance of local authorities to local community is very important. It not only provides financial support, but also helps to elaborate technical drawings, make cost estimate and register CO». Petro Turko, Head of Local Development Agency of Dobromyl town, Lvivska oblast

«Now I see possibility to realize my dream, i.e. cleaning our river in Vozsiyatske village, despite the fact that we cannot receive money for it in the framework of this project». Rohko N.I., biology teacher from Vozsiyatska secondary I-III stage school, Yelanetsky rayon, Mykolaivska oblast

«Big amount of technical documentation, its complexity, shortage of corresponding specialists in the community make the process of micro-project proposals preparation more complicated and it takes longer time for micro-project implementation. But we are grateful to the CBA Project for its help to unite all of us in the community and enable us to believe that we are powerful when we are united. Even in crisis conditions people give money, because they know that they do it for themselves. We do not wait for someone else to come and extend helping hand as we have learned that we must start at first. As our next step will be our own projects implementation: ordering of cemetery, streets, recreation areas». 2.5.4. Financing of micro-projects

Financing for micro-project is taken as an opportunity to establish environment of transparfency and accountability at local level. Upon approval of the micro-project, an agreement is signed between UNDP and the beneficiary CO for implementation of the micro-project to be done by the CO under a set of terms and conditions that are formed to enhance transparency and accountability. Often media and local authroties are involved while conducting the agreement and third dialogue is held in the community for this purpose. Concept of the third dialogue is given in Box - 4.

During the reporting period a total of 25 third dialogue was held while financing the micro-projects (Table - XII), which is 2% of 1175, the minimum potential third dialogue.

In the1st quarter, financing was released for 37 community projects of 10 oblasts, amounting to UAH 508 335,4. For most project, it was the 1st tranche released. Since inception, 49 COs received first tranche, 3 COs received 2nd tranche. The total amount disbursed was UAH 623 213,2 (Table - XIII).

In the situation of financial crisis, local authorities in all oblasts face considerable difficulties as regards cofinancing of community projects. However, authorities tend to look for ways to secure these funds (a) in order to respect their obligations which they undertook by sighning partnership agreements and (b) they are eager to see the result of community based approach in action. Below is the list of most frequent responses of local authorities to find additional resources:

- 1) Refering for help to local business/local entrepreneurs.
- 2) Addressing oblast level authorities with a request to co-finance micro-projects or to increase their share, in case co-financing from oblast budget was previewed.
- 3) In some rayons where funds were attributed to community projects long ago, and where local budgets are being implemented
- 4) Rayon share of co-funding will be taken up by village/city council, instead of rayon-level budget.
- 5) Some local authorities solve the problem by increasing the share of CO input
- 6) Some oblasts (case of Kharkivska and Zaporizka) non-utilized funds collected in the pre-crisis year is being used
- 7) Money can also be found in: (a) development budgets (b) reserve costs, (c) of the non-distributed rest from the balance, money is accumulated and can be forwarded to fund community projects

Other specific responses and examples are quoted in Annex - XVII.

Box - 11. Success Stories of CBA Communities

In Vikno village of Horodenkivsky rayon (Ivano-Frankivska oblast), activists convened meeting of villagers in September 2008 village, where the participants decided to create a community organization and elected the leader. They decided to register their organization officially as a charity organization consisting of 130 community members. On one of the next meetings a decision was made to raise money for the organization keeping – the sum of 5 UAH per quarter from each member.

At the second meeting, all existing problems were discussed, the plan of community development was elaborated, aimed at improving the state of school, kindergarten, equipping the sports ground, and reconstructing roads; and a functioning group to fulfill all the project plans was chosen.

Priority problem was chosen the energy project *Replacement of windows in the school* as many children got ill during autumn-winter period, missed lessons, and studied in classrooms in coats, though there was central heating in the school. The problem of energy conservation at school is urgent for the community so far as the school was built in 1959 and numbers 114 pupils.

Thus, the micro-project proposal was prepared with the budget of 115'977 UAH. Community members gathered their cost sharing of about 8'000 UAH. As of today the works at the site are actively done, it was planned to complete works by the end of March 2009, according to the approved calendar plan.

After the micro-project implementation, CO plans to continue its work, fees will be collected to maintain the project, and local budget funds will be attracted.

At the same time Vikna villagers are planning to start solving the next problem, as the community believed in their own strength. Holding regular meetings has become a habit for the community members.

During the period of the CBA project implementation the community equipped the school territory, planted trees, repaired the school interior and got the vision for their future activities beyond CBA. CO applied for the new initiative in UNDP/TM BonAqua *Every Drop Matters* project.

2.6. Communication and visibility

Communication, visibility and public relation (PR) activities are designed as a part of Project implementation strategy with a purpose to maximize transparency about the Project activities and to lobby for the cause it aims to promote. Specific activities include media events, media coverage, web portal, communication dissemination, visibility tools etc.

During the quarter, wider public and potential participants were familiarized with Project activities and plans through local media and CBA web site. Visibility of EU and UNDP was assured by each of communication activities. Details of the activities are described below:

2.6.1. Media coverage. Media events

In the 1st quarter, media events changed both in quality and quantity. Alonside with events around launching project activities at different levels and signing partnerships that continued in many regions, there were more targeted media events aimed at familiarizing local journalists with process and results of CBA activities. Among such events are donor/partner visits, project opening/launching events and visits of local journalists to field together with Community Development Officers.

During the reporting period, 181 media coverages were registered across Ukraine, including printed and electronic editions, radio and TV reportages (Table - XIV, Chart XVII). Leading oblasts in this respect were Kharkivska (29), Rivnenska (24) and Zaporizka (18). Oblastwise distribution of media coverages is given Chart - XVIII.

Chart - XVII. Media coverage in different types of media in I quarter 2009





Chart - XVIII. Media Coverage of CBA Activities During I Quarter 2009

2.6.2. Issuing Regional Newsletter

In order to duly and timely inform local partners/stakeholders as well as participants about progress of CBA activities in the region, a practice of publishing regional newsletters is in place. In the 1st quarter, OIUs drafted 29 issues of regional newsletter, which was printed and disseminated both electronically (3332 copies) and printed copies (5010 copies), according to the distribution list including oblast administration and council, rayon administration and councils, village councils, local communities, local media and NGOs (see Table - XV for details). Newsletters were also placed on CBA web site.

2.7 Advisory and Management

Various activities were carried out during the reporting period to lay foundation for effective operation of the Project activities. These activities are reflected in terms of administrative and financial management, coordination arrangement, and monitoring, advisory support and resource mobilisation as described in details hereunder.

2.7.1 Donor/Partner visits

On 28 February a delegation of European Ambassadors and Head of Delegation of the European Commission to Ukraine visited community of Zvizdne village, AR Crimea to meet the community participating in CBA Project.





2.7.2. Additional Activities

Knowledge Transfer: As a part of knowledge transfer, IPM Jaysingh Sah visited UNDP Afghanistan during 4 - 14 February to prepare a project document based on community based approach to local development implemented through UNDP Ukraine.

Participation in EDM Project: Along with other UNDP projects, CBA is involved in implementation of the "Every Drop Matters" (EDM) a joint project of UNDP and The Coca-Cola Company aimed at identifying and supporting water solution. EDM is designed as regional partnership initiative in the countries of Euroupe and the CIS. The main objectives are to increase access to safe drinking water, facilitate the use of environmentally sound industrial technologies and promote responsible water resource management.

Call for applications was disseminated among CBA communities, 181 applications were received and processed. On 20 February 2009 the Pre-Selection Committee discussed 181 applications from 20 oblasts, namely, Vinnytska, Ternopilska, Ivano-Frankivska, Luhanska, Zakarpatska, Rivnenska, Chernihivska, Mykolaivska, Kirovogradska, Volynska, Lvivska, Odeska, Cherkaska, Sumska, Khmelnytska, Zhytomyrska, Donetska, Zaporizka, Dnipropetrovska oblasts and Autonomous Republic of Crimea.

According to the selection criteria 31 projects were selected for the second round that include projects from Luhanska (3), Donetska (1), Zaporizka (1), Odeska (1), Mykolaivska (2), Cherkaska (1), Kirovogradska (1), Vinnytska (3), Zakarpatska (1), Sumska (1), Ternopilska (3), Ivano-Fransivska (4), Volynska (2), Chernigivska (1), Khmelnytska (1), Zhytomyrska (1), Rivnenska (2), Lvivska (1) oblasts and ARC (1).

2.7.3 Financial Delivery

Project expenditure during the quarter reached a total of US \$ 366,017 which was 53% of the budget available during that time (Table - XVI). Major achievement took place in the area of partnership establishment and project management followed by training and community projects.

CHAPTER III

LESSONS AND FUTURE OUTLOOK

3.1 Stocking the Experience
3.2 Outlook for future

- Speed and efficiency of project implementation greatly depends on the degree of **interest of local authorities** and/or availability of enthusiastic officials/leadership at OSA/OC and RSA/RC. Involvement of local/regional authorities can facilitate project activities in many aspects including increase in the level of trust in the mind of local population since these authorities are perceived as "guarantors" of realization of communities' initiatives. Due to the variation in response from the stakeholders, there is a time lag between activitiy initiation and result achievement (Details in Charts 2, and Box 6)
- Despite differences in political affiliation, OSA and OC representatives come together to act jointly in favour of the citizens vis-à-vis CBA Project.
- Generally, communities show great enthusiasm when it comes the matter of their empowerment, local development and planning. Community members tend to openly demonstrate their interest and enthusiasm in the project, and actively participate in project activities..
- Main idea of the CBA Project is correctly understood and accepted by local communities as well as local authorities. As a result, main focus is placed on the creation of a pro-active community and its empowerment. Active participation of communities in solving their own problems is a first and most important step towards sustainable local development.
- Seminars, trainings and exposure visits have proved to be an effective way of working with local communities. These activities open up the community members for two way interactive dialogue, mutual trust, understanding and cooperation with OIUs.
- Participation of the representatives of RSA law/ justice departments, state registrar, rayon tax administration etc in trainings for local communities turned out to be effective. They clarified requirements as regards CO statute documentation needed for registration.
- Regular and wide **media coverage** of the CBA activities and achievements in the rayons/communities is not only useful for dissemination of information but also it inspires local communities and promotes the spirit of competition among community organizations.
- Women are usually most active members of village communities.
- **Pilot communities of CBA** feel themselves special and inspired being involved in such an initiative. They communicate more often with similar pilot communities and receive much higher degree of attention from RSA/RC.
- **Leadership problems** In communities where elected leaders are weak and have no contact with the community members, the community members also tend to be passive and incompetent.
- There is a high probability of negative impact of **political and economic instability** on the formation of COs, community planning and realization of micro-projects. Possible elections to Verkhovna rada are also likely to negatively influence the unity of the community organizations and timely implementation of the local initiatives.
- **Economic crisis** and state budget-2009 poses risk to the co-financing of micro-projects from local budget. Room is to be explored to mobilize resources from oblast-level budget. In this context, emphasis is to be made on systematic informing regional leadership, and deputies of oblast council about the Project and its activities.
- In the process of project implementation, there is a need to create **rayon-level Community Resource Centres**, especially in the rayons remote from regional capital.
- **Empowered communities** are able to influence decision-making processes and development processes at their territories through procedures of common planning.
- Effectiveness of **Local Development Forums** is higher in caseby rayon administration/council are involved in its organisation. This reflects the degree of their interest in the Project and allows rayon to feel as a full-fledged partner.
- In the situation where a community perceives a CDOs as its partners rather than a friend, then it seems to gain better understanding about its obligations and responsibilities.
- In rayons where trained community activists are motivated to serve as resource person and provide the same training to the rest of the community members, a much higher degree of mastering and understanding the topics of trainings is achieved.

- During dialogues with communities, situations should be avoided when a representative of authorities voices his/her vision of the problem that needs to be solved. This dissipates the community spirit of helping themselves.
- CBA methodology is process oriented and hence takes time to obtain final results through involvement of various stakeholders and many decision-points in the process (Table XVII)

Key Challenges and potential threats:

- 1. As a regulst of financial crisis, local budgets are tightened budget, and there are difficulties in allocation of resources for community projects. This problem is common for all oblasts.
- 1. Following from this, communities do not have confidence in the co-financing "guarantees" of local authorities. This undermines communities' enthusiasm, and some of them rush to stop project implementation and suspend cooperation with CBA.
- 2. Computer illiteracy is a very widespread problem, especially the use of Excel.
- 3. Passiveness of some communities is one of major problems on the way to mobilization, it becomes the main reason for shifting to a reserve community. People still tend to think that it is local authority which has to take responsibility. Often, local authorities are also inactive and inert. It takes considerable time to change such perception.
- 4. Low level of confidence in the banking system and lack of awareness about dealing with the tax procedure, many communities prefer to keep their membership fees and money raised for community project, in cash rather than on a bank account.
- 5. Low level of technical skill among CO-members causes considerably more difficult to prepare micro-project proposals and fulfil all the requirements for MPP documentation. As a result, MPP sometimes becomes the task of the CO Chairperson or Head of VC. This diminishes involvement of the rest of community members and their feeling of ownership.

3.2 Outlook for Quarter II

Following activities are perceived to take place in the second quarter of the year:

- Continued focus on training and study visits for local, regional and national capacity building;
- Continuation on mainstreaming of community plans and resource mobilisation;
- Continued focus on community projects;
- Review meetings will take place in each region to assess CBA implementation;
- Mid-term evaluation of CBA will be carried out.





Annex – XVII: Ways of Co-Financing Community Projects in Situation of Financial Crisis

Cherkaska oblast:

On 10 April 2009 oblast council decided that each member of council will have UAH 100.000 for solving problems of local communities which they represent. All heads of village councils are now requested to lobby the interest of their OC deputies by presenting proposals, aimed at solving their community's problem.

Mykolaiivska oblast:

However difficult it is to find resources, local authorities take their obligations on co-financing with a great degree of responsibility. In order to facilitate this process, OCC is created at oblast level. Each project will be reviewed by LDF and approved together with distribution of co-financing commitments.

Dnipropetrovsla oblast

Problem of co-financing is addressed by official requests to oblast council, and involvement of local businesses.

Ivano-Frankivska oblast

Funds for community projects were allocated on local budgets on the ground of Partnership Agreements signed in 2008.

Kharkivska oblast

Problem is addressed by the attempt to re-distribute shares of all levels of budgets, the tendency is to involve higher (oblast) level budget to the maximum extent. At the same time, there are some village councils which are ready to release the necessary 45% of co-financing without contribution from rayon/oblast budget.

A lot of hope is laid on local business.

Money saved from last year's budget is offered in some places for financing community projects. Judging by the results of 1st quarter, in several rayons there is a probability that rayon budgets will be duly implemented

Khmenlytska oblast

Rayon authorities release funds under "moral pressure" on the side of oblast authorities and the fact that Partnership Agreement with UNDP settles co-funding obligations.

By approval of oblast budget for 2009, a subvention of UAH 100.000 was previewed for co-financing of community initiatives of the first four pilot rayons (OC decision № 631 of 16 January 2009).

After formal request of RSA, rayon councils adopted the necessary decisions (Novomyrhorodskyi, Oleksandrivkyi, Hayvoronskyi rayons) or reserved the necessary amounts in the non-distributed free rests of the balance. In case village councils also have extra money in their budgets, they take the necessary decisions to fund local community initiatives. In case there are no available funds at VC/CC level, local councils plan to collect the necessary amount through increase of self-taxation.

Khersonska oblast

Use of sponsors' help.

Orientation towards VC/CC budgets for co-financing

Apply to leadership of OSA/OC for financing of community initiatives

In 2 rayons, resources fro community initiatives were timely previewed in the budget-2009. In other mostly subsidized rayons, the issue is solved with involvement of local population and entrepreneurs who intuitively realize their social responsibility.

Lvivska oblast

The amount of UAH 300-400.000 for co-financing of 5 projects is not critical for rayon budget. Often, community initiatives are funded from the reserves of VC/CC. Of 20 micro-projects, 5 can be co-financed solely by VC/CC.

Poltavska oblast

The issue of co-financing is quite acute. Initially, oblast authorities promised to provide 35% of co-financing. However, oblast council decreased this amount to 25%, and the share of rayon budgets increased.

Despite crisis, 2 rayons released funding for their 5 COs. However, money was transferred to the account of VCs and not COs, as per Law of Ukraine.

Rivnenska oblast

Financing from rayon budgets are released by decisions of local councils. Most often, they come from 'budgets of development'. The amounts are relatively small, such amounts can always be found and allocated for the purpose of community initiatives. Crucial in this regard is the willingness of local authorities.

Sumska oblast

The cost of design estimates is paid from rayon budgets as their share. Village councils have not yet spent their undistributed rest of VC budget, and keep it reserved fro financing community projects. Most part of financing is expected from oblast level budget.

Ternopilska oblast

In context of financial crisis, it is planned, that financing of CO initiatives will be done through:

- in case of financing of repair works in schools from budget line "Major Repairs", as in this case it is easier to transfer money from one budget code to another;
- financing of projects in urban villages will be done from local budgets: here there is a higher probability to attract incomes to local budget, e.g. for selling/rent of land or property;
- issuing letters from local communities and then from rayon to oblast authorities with a request for additional funds for each community so as to co-finance according to the approved cost-estimate documentation.

Zakarpatska oblast

Most rayons find money for CO projects in the 'development budget'. In some cases, village council will co-finance the project entirely.

Zaporizka oblast

For communities, the most likely solution is an increased share of oblast budget. Presently, there are some funds saved from 2008 and also money of 'development budget'; they will most probably be used to finance community projects, though they may be not enough.

Zhytomyrska oblast

Sources of co-financing CO projects:

- Funds returned from bank deposits (?)
- Release of subventions by oblast authorities upon official request from rayon
- · From rayon budget by directing part of financing for budgetary institutions, by decision of rayon council
- Involvement of local business
